## CANADIAN WINS ASHRAE AWARD FOR ENERGY RECOVERY

Gilles A. Raymond, Eng., vice president of Les Consultants CRS, Inc. in Laval, Quebec, has won first place in Category IV of the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) 1984 Energy Awards Program. Category IV covers existing industrial facilities or processes.

Raymond received his award for the implementation of an energy recovery system for the Satexil Inc., Texgran Division Weaving Mill in Grand'-Mère, Quebec.

ASHRAE's annual Energy Awards recognize outstanding achievements in energy management and energy conservation design. Awards are presented for new construction, modification to existing structures and the use of alternative or renewable energy. To receive an award, entrants must demonstrate substantial energy savings during at least a one-year period, while assuring the comfort of building occupants.

"Ten energy-conserving features implemented in this plant cut energy use in half," Perry said. "Various methods of heat recovery were used, including the construction of a 225,000 liter reservoir for reclaimed hot water. Old processing equipment was replaced by new and more efficient machines. This project serves as an example of an effective overall energy conservation program because all types of energy systems were examined. The project also resulted in actual improvements in production time and reduced maintenance on many systems."
