

RE: BILL TO AMEND THE OPERATING ENGINEERS ACT

The American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air Conditioning Engineers Inc. (ASHRAE) is an international technical society which is recognized as the world's leading depository of technology related to heating, refrigeration and air conditioning.

Its 50,000 plus individual members include consulting engineers, design professionals, contractors, employees of manufacturers, testing laboratories, research and educational institutions and all levels of government. In Ontario there are about 1,600 ASHRAE members.

The London Chapter of ASHRAE has long awaited introduction of the bill to amend the <u>OEA</u> and anticipated its introduction in the fall 1992 legislative session. We learned recently that the bill to amend the Act is unlikely to be introduced in either the fall 1992 or the spring 1993 sessions owing to a crowded legislative agenda. We also understand that, although a draft bill was recently made public, an early target date for introduction is extremely doubtful.

This news disappoints ASHRAE - London Chapter members who take responsibility for selecting, purchasing, installing and operating refrigeration equipment. For numerous reasons described below, we feel the Government should expedite introduction of the bill to amend the <u>OEA</u> and its Regulation.

Reasons to Expedite Making Amendments to the OEA and its Regulation:

Because of worldwide concern with the deteriorating environment and specifically, the thinning ozone layer, the most common refrigerants in use worldwide today are being phased out at an accelerated pace to meet the objectives of the United Nations' Montreal Protocol. The original target date for a total ban on CFC production was 2000; this is now advanced to 1997.

Uncertainty about the <u>OEA</u> is hindering the withdrawal of these refrigerants from service in Ontario.

2) The current <u>OEA</u> requires different design conditions and operating procedures for high and low pressure refrigeration plants depending on installation size.

Our industry is pleased with the proposed bill recently released by the Minister. We will assess how operating procedures and refrigeration plant design are affected and will forward any questions we may have to MCCR.

Until the legislation is amended to update requirements, building owners (investors) continue to be unwilling to invest in or make firm commitments on replacing or modifying existing refrigeration plants to permit the use of non-CFC or ozone-friendly refrigerants with low global warming potential.

- Ontario is one of the few North American jurisdictions requiring attended operation of high pressure refrigeration equipment utilizing non-CFC refrigerants.
- 4) The Minister of the Environment announced recently that a draft Environmental Bill of Rights will be introduced after a period of public consultation. This is laudable.

However the present <u>OEA</u>, which inhibits the use of some environmentally benign refrigerants, would seem to not comply with - or at least, fail to be in keeping with - the spirit of the proposed bill.

- 5) MCCR staff worked diligently for many years to update the <u>OEA</u> and achieve consensus among diverse industry stakeholders including building owners, equipment manufacturers, refrigerant suppliers, organized labour and consulting engineers.
 - In consideration of exceptional work and general satisfaction by all parties, the Government should move aggressively to amend the legislation.
- Any political concerns the Government may have for not proceeding with introduction of the bill to amend the <u>OEA</u> are overshadowed by worsening environmental conditions and public awareness of the issue.

On behalf of the London Chapter of ASHRAE, I urge the Premier and the Minister of Consumer and Commercial Relations to champion this cause by repositioning the bill on the Government's agenda for introduction in the spring 1993 session.

A clear direction for the <u>OEA</u> eliminates the uncertainty that has immobilized industry action to date. With a direction, our industry can respond with solutions that are safe for the environment and safe for users of the equipment as required by the <u>OEA</u>.

I look forward to your comments and views on expediting this matter.
