Proposed Chapter By-Laws were submitted by CLIFF MORRISON AND A LIST OF PROSPECTIVE members by Jack Vanstone and a number of other matters pertaining to meeting dates, Chapter dues, speakers and the date of a further organized ^{general} meeting to be held on Feb 16th 1971 with additional
